



## Guide for the High Impact Collaborative Grant

**In no more than a total two pages, please provide the following:**

1. *Project Title*
2. *Identify Primary Grant Contact (Lead PI) and Primary Grant Organization*
3. *Identify all collaborating investigators (at least two at each organization) and collaborating organizations.*
4. *Decision Support Project Description*
  - *What problem does this address?*
  - *Why is the work important?*
  - *What preliminary research or evidence proves that your approach can work and impact patient care and/or clinical practice in 1-3 years? (note: you should have hard data that works on a small scale that can show it can actually work and effect patient care and practice).*
  - *Provide a brief summary of how your project will involve the direct and active participation of a clinician, how the project will be accomplished. Include data resources utilized, annotated or created,*
  - *Describe why this problem has not been solved previously and very briefly mention relevant work that has been done.*
  - *Provide a statement of how your project will impact clinical care and how you will share your data or other findings with the community.*
  - *Comment on scalability and on institutional resources and support that will lend to the potential success of the project.*
  - *Provide a timetable for the project.*

*Attach separately:*

5. *Project Budget, Personnel, and Funding History*
  1. **Budget:** *Provide a detailed budget, broken down by year 1, 2 & 3, if applicable. ICI awards may not be used for laboratory expenses.*
  2. **Project personnel:** *Provide the name, title, and role of all individuals who will be involved in the project, including the Principal Investigators (PI)/Co-PI(s). Indicate the percent effort that each person is expected to devote to the project. Indicate the Primary Grant Contact (Lead PI coordinator) and Primary Grant Organization for the project. Provide bios of all key project personnel and collaborator(s), preferably in NIH format or similar format that is abbreviated to emphasize experience relevant to the research proposal.*
  3. **Funding history:** *If applicable, indicate any other sources of funding for the proposed or related projects, including the amounts and granting organizations.*
